8. Create your own bookmark or cootie catcher for travel fun.
9. Play games with friends or family. [indoor or outdoor]
10. Learn more about the state or capital of where you are visiting OR play the president scramble, capital matching, or color state flowers in the kit.
11. Strengthen your brain and complete a brain teaser.
12. Make up your own game or craft to play on the road trip.
13. For fun, complete an easy community service project in the car or learn about projects you can assist with later.
14. Create a journal and write down all the things that you did on your trip.

Road Trip Recipes

2 Yummy Trail Mixes

2 cups of animal crackers	2 cups of plain popcorn
1 cup of peanuts (any kind)	2 cups of cheesy crackers
1 cup of cheese fish crackers OR	2 cups of mini pretzels or pretzel rods
1/2 cup of shredded coconut	1 cup of raisins
1 cup of dried fruit or raisin	1 cup of semi-sweet chocolate chips



Mix together and serve in baggies. You can also add cereal.



Raisin Banana Sandwich

2 slices of raisin bread
 1-2 tablespoons of Nutella® or peanut butter (or any other kind of spread)
 1 banana

Toast the slices of bread. You can rub a little butter on them if you like after you take them out. Slice the banana into slices. Spread the Nutella, peanut butter, or whatever spread you're using on the slices of bread. Place the banana on the pieces of bread and close. Wrap in tin foil and enjoy!

Fruity Oat Bars

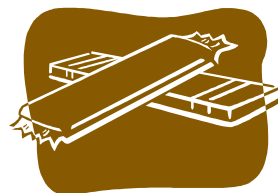
3/4 cup of unsalted butter
 3 tablespoons of honey
 3/4 cup of brown sugar
 1/2 (or more) creamy peanut butter
 2 3/4 cups of rolled oats
 1/4 cup of dried apricots
 2 tablespoons of sunflower seeds
 2 tablespoons of sesame seeds



Preheat the oven to 350 F. Grease a 8 1/2 x 22 inch pan. Mix the butter, honey, and sugar over low heat until the sugar melts. Add the peanut butter and stir until mixed. Chop the apricots into small pieces. Add the brown sugar, oats, apricots, sunflower and sesame seeds. Press the mixture into the pan and bake for 20 minutes. Cut into bars—serves about 16.

No Bake Cookies

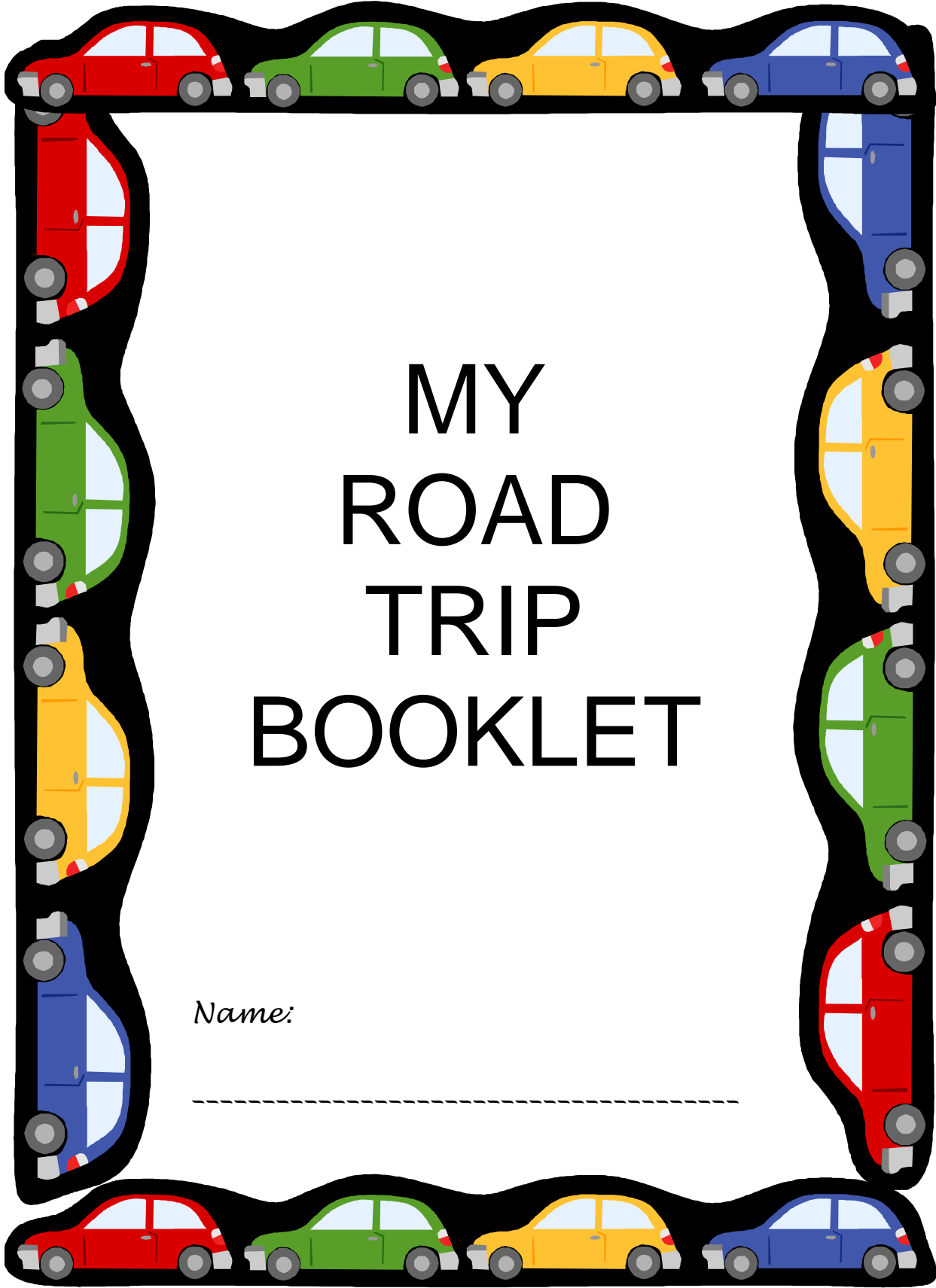
1 1/2 cups of sugar
 4 tablespoons of cocoa
 1/4 stick of butter
 1/2 cup of peanut butter
 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract
 4 cups of quick oats
 1/2 cup of milk and waxed paper



Place the sugar, cocoa, butter, vanilla and milk in the saucepan and bring it to a boil. Let it boil for a minute. Remove from heat and add in the peanut butter. Stir thoroughly. Quickly add in the oatmeal. Stir quickly as it will start getting stiff. Drop the mixture by large spoonful on the waxed paper. Let it cool and serve when they have hardened into cookies.

- crackers

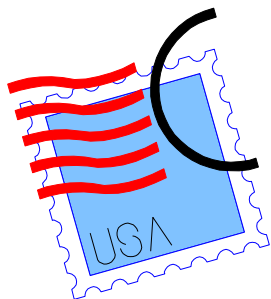
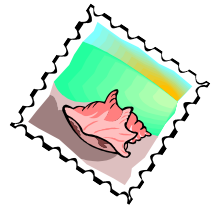
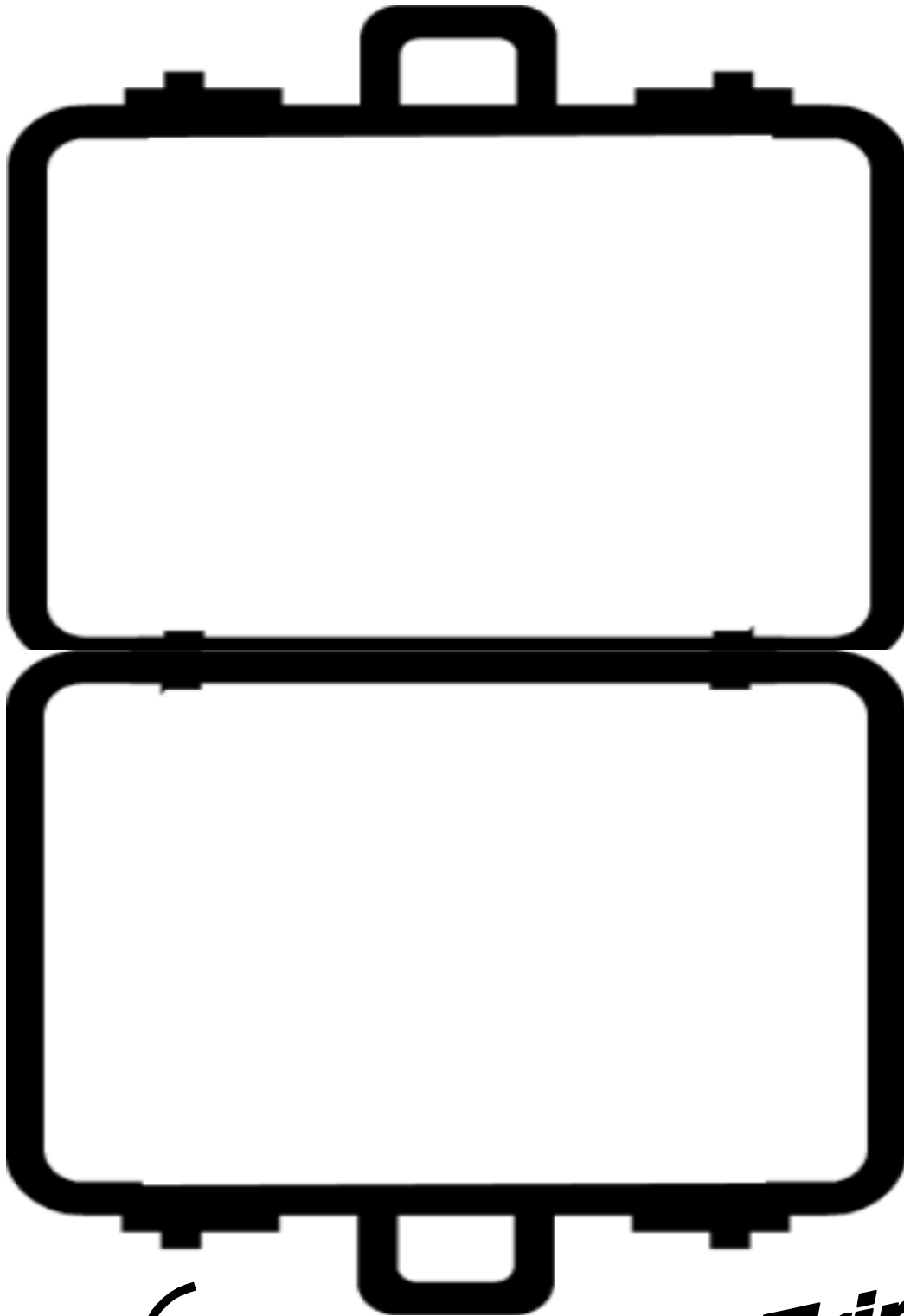

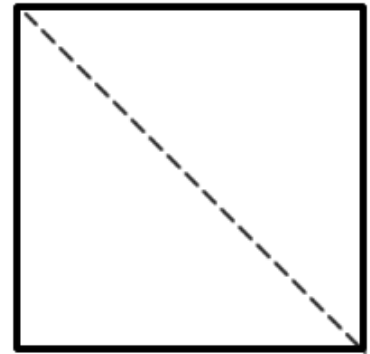
Make a Cootie Catcher (also called a Fortune Teller)



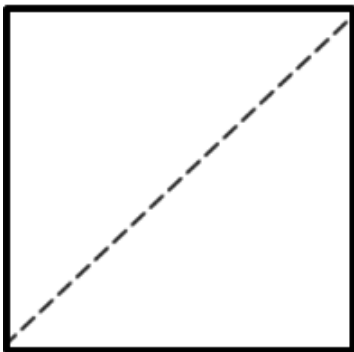
Start with a plain piece of white paper.
8 1/2 X 11



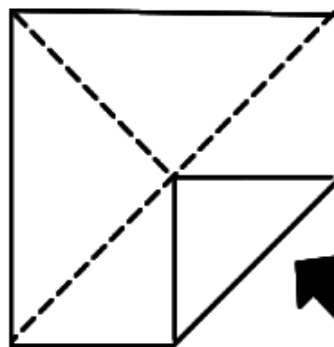
Take the left hand corner and fold it to the side of the page to create a triangle. Cut off the excess paper.



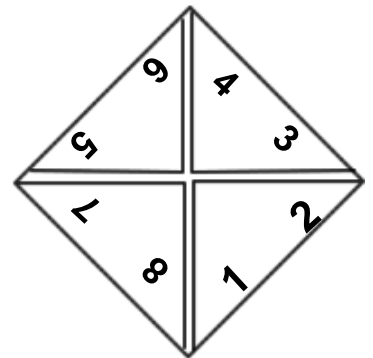
Open the triangle and you will have this square with a folded crease in the center.



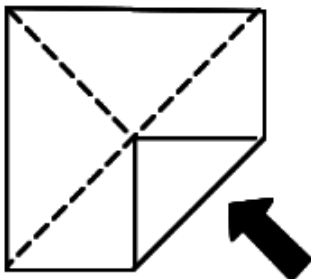
Fold the square diagonal in the other direction to create an "X" pattern of creases in the center of square.



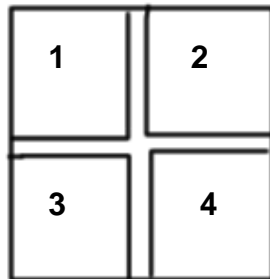
Begin folding the corners towards the center of the square.



Your square should look like this now. Number the triangles. There will be a crease on each large triangle large enough to place two numbers. Open each flap and write a fortune on each triangle inside. When your fortunes are written, close all the flaps.



Flip the folded square over and begin folding the corners toward the center of the square.



Your square should look like this now. Number each corner as shown.



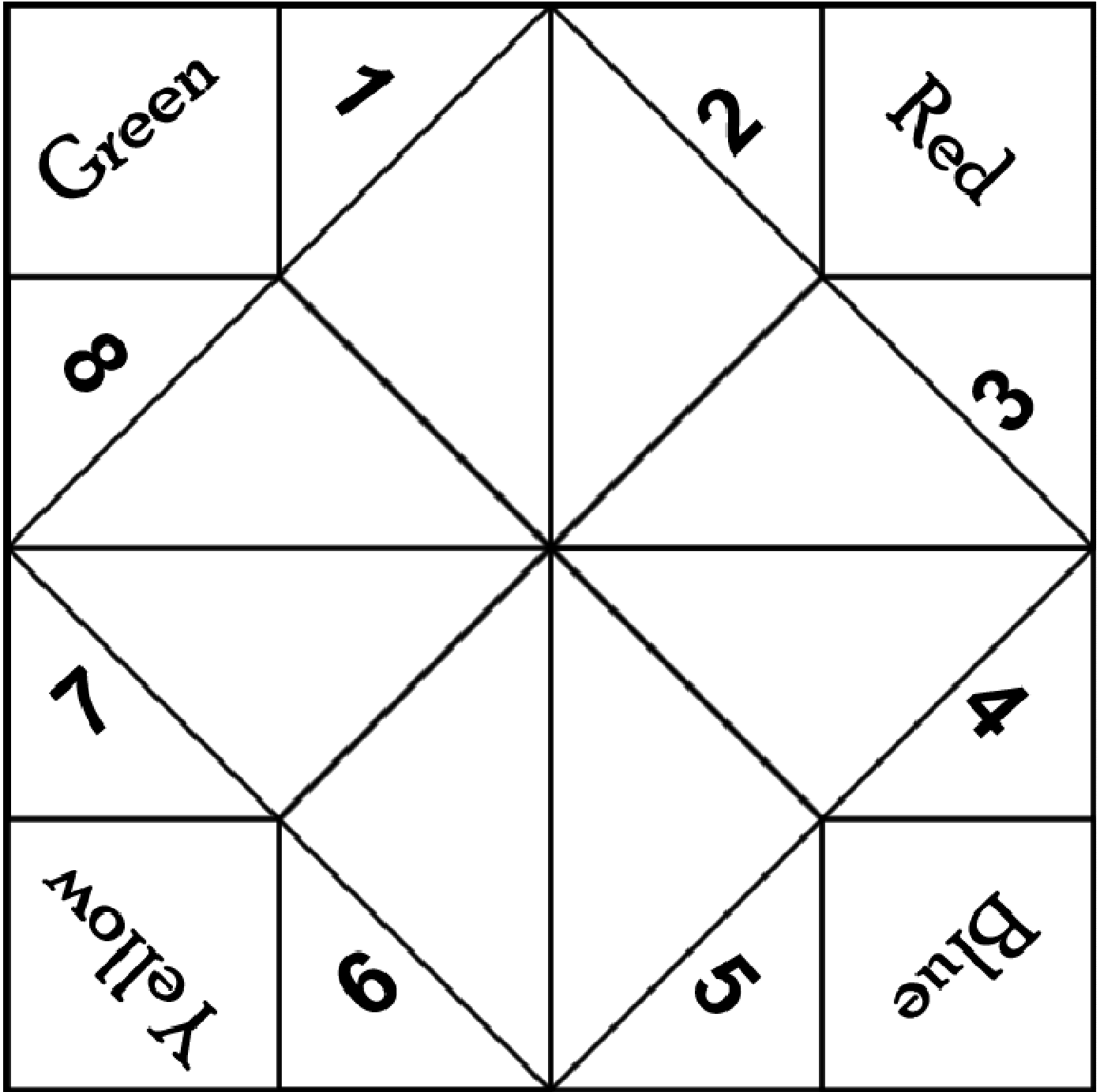
Hold the paper in front of you like a square. Fold it in half vertically and open it back up again.



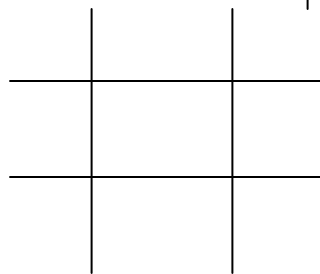
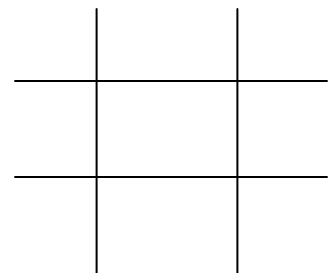
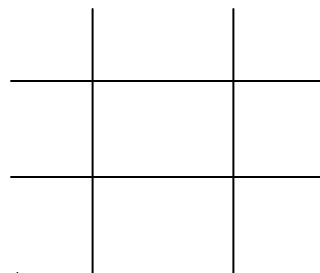
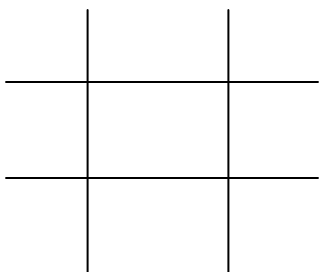
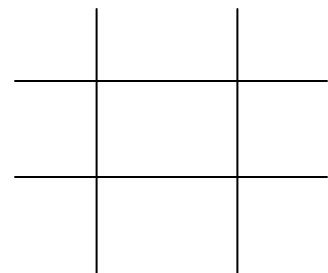
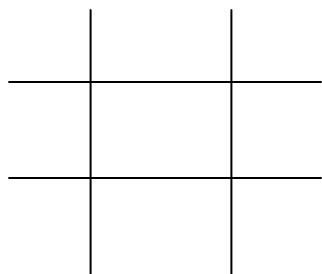
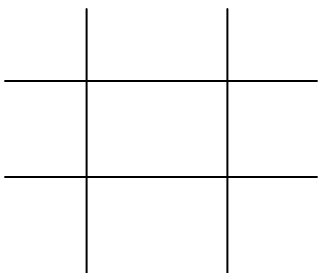
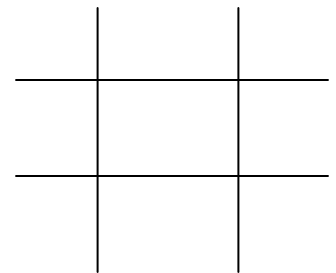
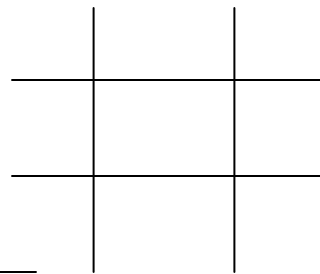
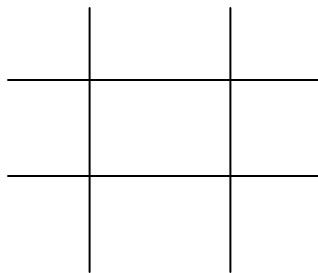
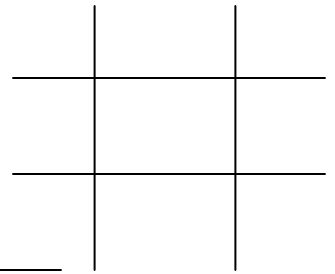
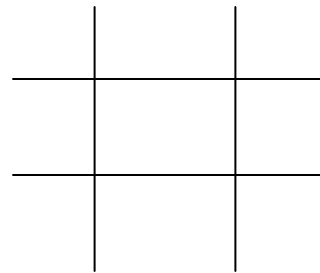
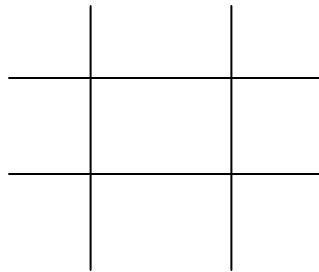
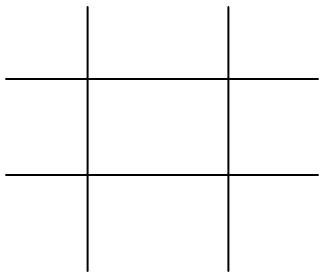
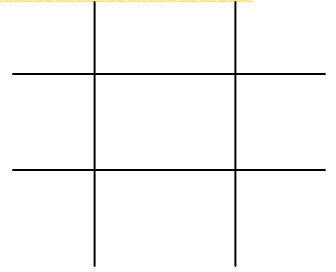
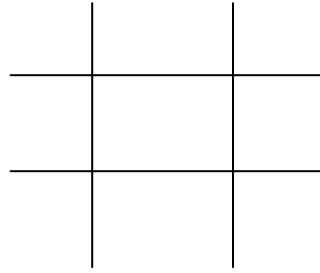
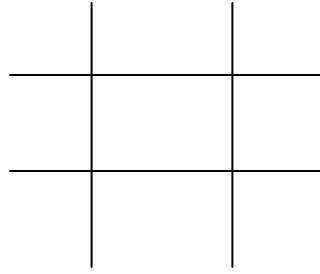
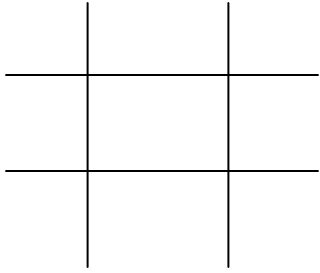
Slide your thumbs and fingers under the four flaps. Rotate your hands, bringing your thumbs and index fingers together. The cootie catcher should expand as you move it.

Begin folding the corners towards the center of the square. The triangles are already numbered. Open each flap and write a fortune on each triangle inside. When your fortunes are written, close all the flaps. Flip the folded square over and begin folding the corners toward the center of the square. You will see the colors written on the squares. Slide your thumbs and fingers under the four flaps. Rotate your hands, bringing your thumbs and index fingers together. The cootie catcher should expand as you move it. 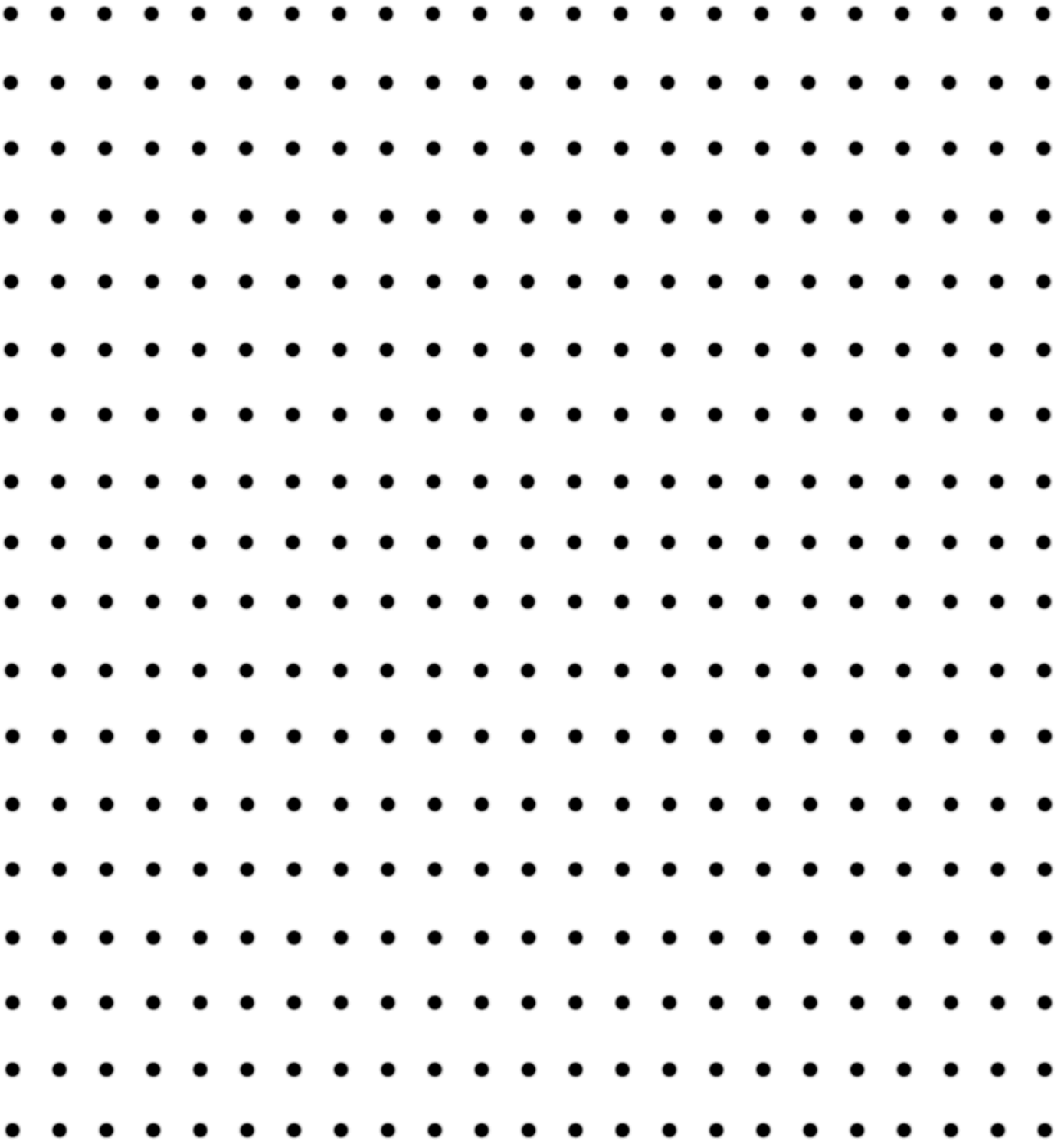
Hangman

Community Service to Do in the Car!

Fleece Blanket for Cancer Patients, Soldiers, Animals, or Children

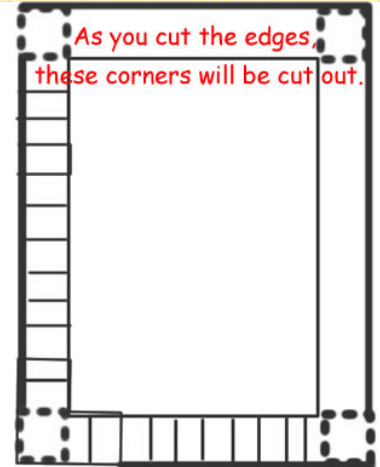
Materials needed:

- Less than a yard blanket would be nice to donate to the local animal shelters.
- 1 1/2 yard piece of polar fleece (Elementary school children)
- 2 yards of polar fleece (for teens)

Fleece is usually about 55" wide.

Directions:

- When purchased, sides of polar fleece have a rolled edge or a selvage. Please trim this edge off prior to creating the blanket.
- If you need a cutting guide place a piece of masking tape 5" in from the edge on top and bottom of blanket to be used as a cutting guide.
- Cut top and bottom sides into 1" x 6" strips (cut toward center of blanket to make fringe). Eventually, you will cut out a square in the corners by creating your fringes. See diagram on the right. Remove masking tape.
- Tie overhand knot on each strip to create a finished fringe edge as shown on the patch.



Create A Pillowcase



Participants of all ages can create pillowcases and distribute them to a variety of organizations. You can decorate pillowcases with fabric markers. You can also decorate pillow cases to place toys in for children during the holiday season or birthday pillowcases to be distributed throughout the year at shelters or food banks. Make sure you label it with a tag for gender and age. Please use cotton material for hospital patients and wash your material prior to donating it. FAQ's and how to sew or decorate a pillow is listed on our website.

Create Beautiful Grocery Bags

Let the manager of the local grocery store know about the project and its environmental education message.

- Borrow.** Contact a local grocery store that uses large paper grocery bags. See if the manager will let you "borrow" enough bags so that each participant can decorate one. Grocers usually get these bags in "bundles" of 500.
- Decorate.** Have participants decorate the bags with pictures of the earth, environmental messages, the name of your group, etc. Be creative! *DO NOT allow participants to write their last names on any bags.*
- Deliver.** A couple of days before Earth Day you and/or your group should return the decorated bags to the grocery store - with many thanks to the manager! The store then uses these bags to place groceries in to happy and amazed shoppers on Earth Day. *If you can not deliver them by Earth Day pick a day that works for the grocer. The point is to express your environmental awareness in a special way.*
- Report.** Fill out the Report Form on the project web site www.earthdaybags.org with a count of how many bags your school made. Please, only one report per school, group, etc. All reports will be posted on the Earth Day Groceries Project website.
- Order** your patch through Patchwork Designs, Inc. and show off your accomplishments of this wonderful project.



Make Cards for the Elderly, Cancer Patients, Military Soldiers, Shelter, etc.

Simply fold a piece of construction paper, cardstock, or plain paper in half and decorate the cards. Make as many as you want! They can be thank you, thinking of you, holiday themed (thanksgiving, Christmas, Valentine's Day, etc.), or just a hello! They appreciate them more than you know. Make sure to **ONLY** put your first name on there. Deliver to a church, shelter, elderly home, hospital, etc.

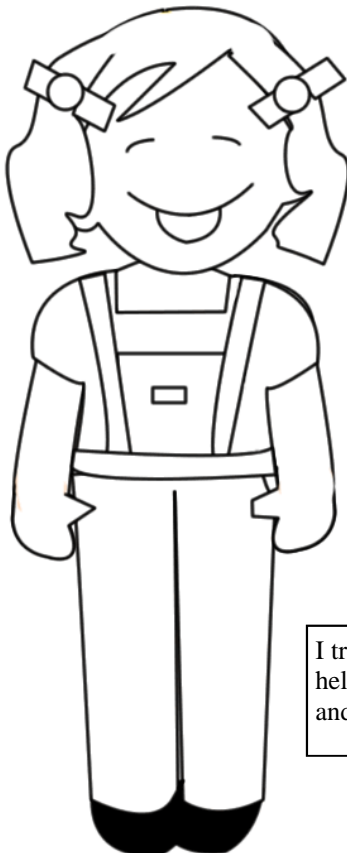

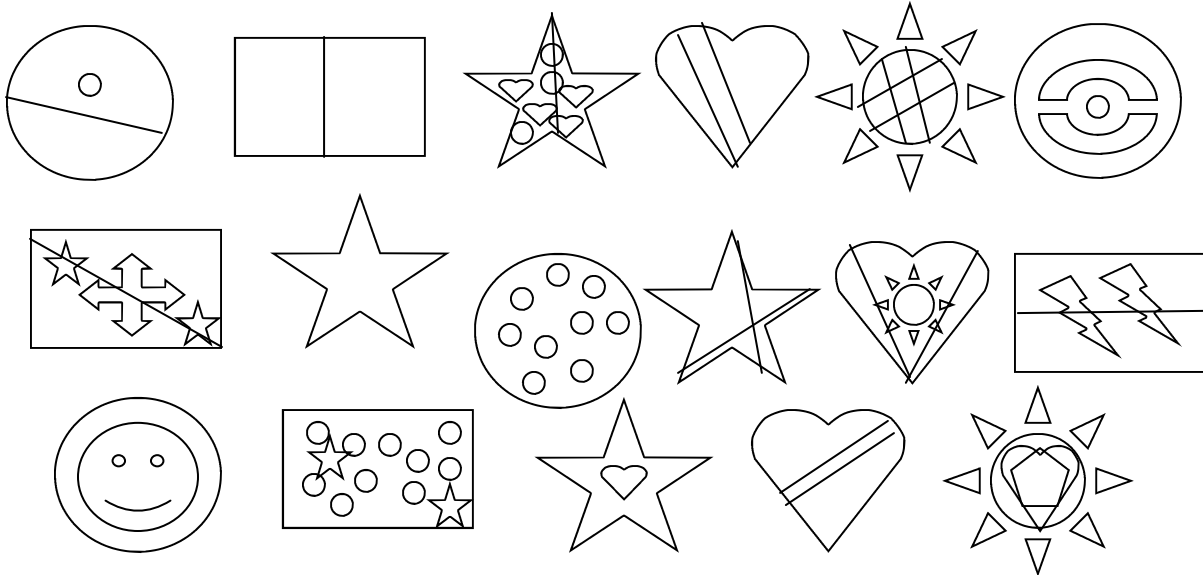

Games That Involve Your Brain!

Going on A Picnic or In My Attic...

Go around the car and ask something that is in the attic or something you would bring to a picnic. You have to start with the letter "A" and go around the car. To make it harder, have each person remember what the last person said and all the words before. For example, I'm going on a picnic and I'm bringing...an apple, a banana, cherries, dishes, eggs, etc or In my attic I have...ants, balloons, cake, dinosaur bones, electrical wires, etc.



I Spy...



Pick someone to be the spy. Have them pick something inside the car (outside wouldn't be fair!) that is a color or texture. Start your sentence with "I spy..." and have the people inside your car guess what you are seeing. For example, "I spy...something red!" It could be mom's shirt, the cover of your notebook, a pencil, the shiny red seatbelt light, etc. Get creative!

Who Am I?

Pick someone to start the game and have them think of someone or something but don't say it out loud. Have someone start guessing with questions like, "Are they an actress? Do they sing? Are they famous? Are they on TV?" They can only answer in "yes" or "no." You can give hints such as: "They are known for being in a band" or "They are on the Disney channel." Whoever guesses first gets to go next!



What Place Am I?



This game is similar to the last, but requires more knowledge and creativity. Have someone think of a state, country, or place (this can be from the beach to Germany!). They can give hints such as: "There is sand here" or "They have lots of snow here!" The questions asked can be: "Is it in Europe?" "Do we have one in our house?" (like a kitchen) or "Is it near China?"

Starting & Ending

Have someone say a random word. After they say it, say a word that ends with the last letter of the word they said. To make it harder, have the words have to stick to a theme, such as: beach items, packing, state names, girl names, etc. For example: "Alaska," "Alabama," "Arkansas," "South Dakota," etc.



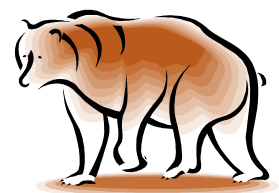

Have someone start a story. Go around the car and have them say a sentence or two and stop when the story is over or when you change into another one. For example: "It's Halloween and it's dark outside..." "Trick-or-treaters are out and ringing doorbells. Then...!"

Luckily & Unluckily

This game is similar to the last but requires more creativity! Have someone come up with a bad event, and the next person has to fix the event. They need to start with "unluckily" and the solution has to start with "luckily." To make it harder, they have to relate them! For example, "Unluckily, there is a bear in this car!" "Luckily, you have a bear trap!" "Unluckily, he escapes!" "Luckily, mom sings him to sleep!"



Games That Involve a Pen and Paper!

Drawing a Picture

Pick someone to go first. They think of something to draw (such as: a cat). The other people in the car try to guess the picture. Whoever guesses the picture gets to draw next. To make it harder, you can make the limit of 10 guesses or award points to the correct guesser and whoever gets to 15 wins.



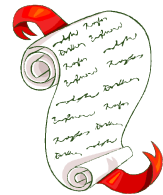
HORSE



The object of this game is to get everyone to spell a word, but not you! Pick a person to go first. They pick a word to spell and only say the first letter. Ex. Doll—"D". The next person tries to guess the word or starts their own word and adds the next letter. Ex. "Dough"—"D-O". The next person does the same. Ex. "Dog"—"D-O-G." (or they could have picked "Double" - "D-O-U"). The next player can spell "D-O-U-B" or pick another word, such as: "Dough", "Doubt", etc. If you spell a whole word, you get a letter of HORSE added to you, beginning with "H." Keep track of this on a piece of paper. The person that spells HORSE loses.

Words, Words

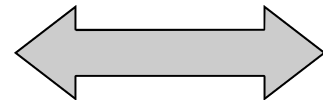
Have the people in the car each get a piece of paper and a pen/marker/crayon. The goal is to have as many words as you can according to the category. The category can be: the beach, movies, Europe, etc. The only catch is that they cannot use the category word! Have someone time them for a minute or two. When the time runs out, count up the words. Whoever has the most words can choose the next category.



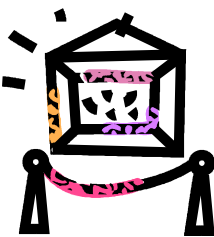
Two variations:

1. Have the category be a letter. If they pick "A," every word has to start with an "A." Follow the same rules as above.
2. Have the category be a number, but it has to be higher than 1. If they pick "2" then every word has to have 2 letters in it. Ex. To, by, ex, is, it, etc.

Stretching Your Knowledge



Have someone pick a very long word. Have someone time them for a minute or two. The goal of this game is to make as many little words out of a big word. Ex. Serendipity—dip, siren, pity, pit, tee, see. Whoever has the most words gets to pick the next big word.



Finish My Artwork

This game works best with 3 or more players, but it can be played with 2. Give everyone something to write with that doesn't bleed or show through paper. Give the first player a piece of paper. Have them draw something that needs to be completed. For example, a head, a tail, a mouth, etc. Fold it in half and pass it to the next player. They draw something on it to finish the artwork a little more (nose, eyes, legs, etc.) The crazier the better! The first person to finish the drawing completely wins.

A variation:

Instead of drawing part of the artwork, draw something (or a half of something) on a piece of paper (such as a circle, heart, balloon, squiggle, etc.) and pass it to the next player to change it into something. A circle can be changed into a smiley face, flower, balloon, etc. The crazier the shape, the harder it is to make something out of it! The first player to give up loses. Have fun!

Games That Involve a Deck of Cards!



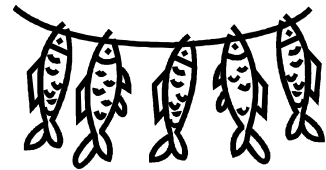
Banana Split (or Baloney Sandwich)

This game requires 3 or more players. Shuffle the cards and deal them out to the players until all of them are gone. Have the players pick up their cards and organize them by matches in their hand. Pick one player to go first. You have to start with the number 2. They lay down 1-4 cards and say “___2’s” - they could be lying or telling the truth. Ex. The first player lays down 3 2’s and says it and if another player thinks they are lying, then they can say, “Banana Split!” If they were lying, then they pick up all the cards that have been laid down so far. But if they were telling the truth, then the player has to pick up all the cards. This game continues in order of the cards. (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, J, Q, K, A, 2...) Play until someone runs out of their cards and they are the winner.

A trick is to look at your own hand first. If you had 2 2’s, then you know they are lying because you have 2 of the 4 2’s available in a deck of cards.

Go Fish

This game works with 2 or more players. Deal out each player 7 cards and place the rest in the middle (you could place them in the card container so they don’t spill). Make pairs of the cards in your hands—example, 2 4’s, 2 Queens, etc. and place them outside, face up, so people know what matches you have.



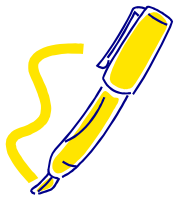
Pick someone to go first. They pick one of their cards that they don’t have a match of and ask any other player if they have it. Example—“Mom, do you have a 6?” If they have it, then they give it to them. If they don’t have it they say, “Go Fish!” The player can be mean and say they don’t have it even if they do. Lay down the matches as you get them. The first player out of cards wins.

Queen of Spades (“Old Maid”)

This game can be played with 2 or more players. Take one Queen out and deal all the of the cards out. Make pairs of the cards in your hands—example, 2 4’s, 2 Queens, etc. and place them outside, face up, so people know what matches you have. Have each player fan out the rest of their cards out in their hand and have the player clockwise to them pick one. Make and lay down matches as you play and pick clockwise. Repeat until there is one card left—the Queen of Spades. Whoever has the Queen of Spades or Old Maid tries to get rid of the card. Whoever is stuck with the Queen of Spades loses.



Markers (“Spoons”)



This game works the best with 6-16 players but can be played with 3 or more players. You will need a marker or another object for each player except one. Place in an area where everyone can reach them. If you have 3 players, you need 2 markers/objects. Deal 4 or 7 cards to each player. 7 cards is for a harder game, 4 cards is for an easier game. Have the players pick one card from each of their hand and pass it to the right of them. **The object of this game is to get 2 matches or a 4 of a kind (4 of the exact same card)—4 cards. Or a combination of matches, 3 of a kind, or 4 of a kind—7 cards.**

Start the game by picking a card from the deck. If you need it to make a match, then take it. But if you don’t, you set it back down on the deck face up. Only the player to your right can pick up the card you just laid down. (You can make this easier by saying anyone can pick it up). Once someone has completed their hand with the bolded rules above, they pick up a marker or the object that they picked. Once someone has picked it up, anyone can pick up the next ones, no matter if they have completed their hand. Try to pick it up as quietly as possible. The player that doesn’t receive an object loses.

Road Trip BINGO

- **Items Needed:** Bingo Cards, Pen or Marker
- Copy the Road Trip Bingo Cards for each child or purchase a book for each one.
- Hand out one bingo card to each child. There are four different cards to choose from.
- Mark off what you see while driving.
- **Options:** Decide what pattern is made on the card to win.
- **Straight Bingo:** Make a horizontal, diagonal OR vertical line to win Bingo.
- **Blackout Bingo:** All images must be marked or covered to get Bingo.
- **Square Bingo:** Fill the card in the shape of a square, covering all the edges on the board.
- **U Bingo:** Fill the card in the shape of a U right-side up, upside down, or sideways.
- **T Bingo:** Fill the card in the shape of a T right-side up, upside down, or sideways.

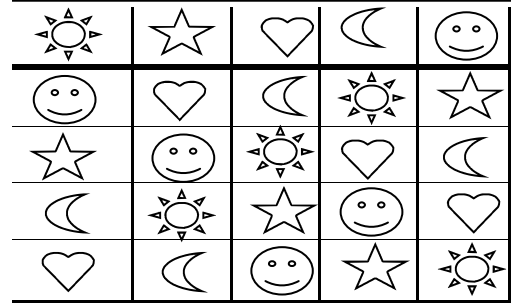

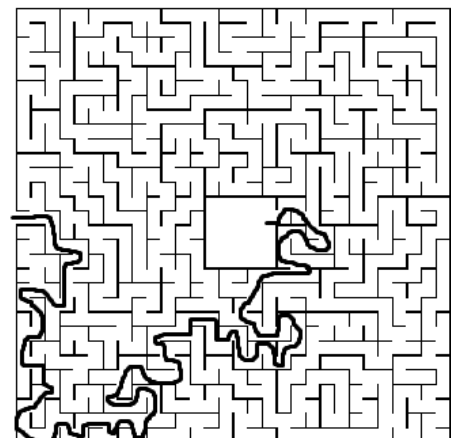
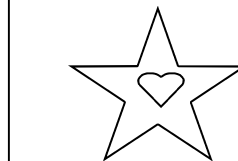
